

July 2019- Boerne Fire Department Monthly Report

- The Boerne Fire Department responded to 115 incidents for the month of July 2019, compared to 89 incidents in July 2018. Firefighters have responded to 707 incidents so far this year.
- Fire Department members spent a total of 179.76 man hours responding to incidents within the City limits and 308.59 man hours responding to incidents outside the City limits, for a total of 488.35 hours responding to incidents in July 2019.
- Personnel spent 10.5 hours attending meetings and 86 hours in training sessions during the month of July 2019.
- Fire Department members have spent a total of 5094.41 hours since January 1, 2019 responding to incidents, attending meetings, attending training sessions and participating in extra activities.
